South Huron Minor Hockey Association Women's "PINK ON THE RINK" Hockey Tournament

RULES – 2017

1. CHA rules and OWHA rules shall apply except where listed below.
2. All Teams must be registered with the OWHA and CHA.
3. All teams from outside Canada require a Travel Permit, Certified Roster and Medical Insurance.
4. Birth Certificates must be available for the players when registering.
6. Teams must submit all player pick-up forms to the Tournament Convenor or OWHA Tournament Representative prior to the first game played.
5. Team Representatives must check in at the registration desk one (1) hour prior to the team's first game. Teams must be available to play thirty (30) minutes prior to their scheduled games.
6. There will be a maximum of seventeen (17) skaters plus two (2) goaltenders allowed per team, as well as a combined total of five (5) coaches, managers or trainers on the bench. A player may play for only one team during the tournament.
7. All teams are guaranteed 3 games. There will be one championship game per division.
8. Round Robin play will determine group placing. Two (2) points will be awarded for a win, one (1) for a tie.
9. No overtime during round robin games.
10. Any game with a 5 goal differential will be running time at the start of the third period (or anytime thereafter). A return to stop time will result once a goal difference of 3 is reached.
11. In the event of a tie in a pool or division, the following tie-breakers will be used:
 - a) Record of most wins
 - b) Record against other tied team (not applicable in a 3 way tie or more)
 - c) Goals for percentage (GF%) of all games played (formula to be used is: $GF/(GF+GA) = GF\%$)
 - d) Fewest goals against
 - e) Most goals for
 - f) Fewest penalty minutes
 - g) Toss of coin.

12. All division games period lengths will be 10-10-12 for Novice, Atom and Peewee. Period lengths for Bantam, Midget and Senior will be 12-12-12. There will be a 2 minute warm-up.
13. In semi-final and final play, ties will be broken in the following manner
 - a) 5 minutes stop time sudden victory (3 on 3), players can be changed at any time, goalies may be pulled at any time and a substitute player may be used at any time. Teams do not change ends for over time or shoot outs. Penalties will carry over into sudden death overtime from regular time. At no time will there be less than 3 players and a goalie on the ice. Power plays will be 4-on-3 or 5-on-3, with the penalized player joining the play at the end of their penalty time. Play will return to 3-on-3 at the next stoppage in play.
 - b) Three player shoot-out from each team, if still tied, subsequent shots will be sudden victory from rotating shooters from the bench. Each team must designate 3 shooters on the game sheet prior to the start of each game (S1, S2, S3). Any player serving a penalty at the end of the game is not eligible to participate in the shootout. If player S1, S2 or S3 is serving a penalty when the game ends then the team may select an alternate shooter. Players do not change ends after third period.
 - c) If tied after 3 shooters a sudden death shootout will commence with each team designating 1 shooter (other than S1, S2, S3) at a time until all players on the game sheet except goalies have shot. This process will be repeated until a winner is decided.
 - d) The Referees decision is final and not subject to appeal or grievance.
14. One thirty (30) second time out for semi-finals and championship game.
15. Intent to injure and fighting penalties will result in the player being ejected from the game and the remainder of the tournament.
16. No body checking is allowed in any division.
17. All players must wear BNQ Approved Neck Protectors.
18. All decisions of the Tournament Organizing Committee are final. If a team is not able to arrive for a scheduled game due to inclement weather (road closures), they must contact the tournament convenor at least 1 hour before the scheduled game time. The tournament committee will make all reasonable attempts to reschedule the game. If, however, it is not reasonable to reschedule the game, the game will be forfeited.
